IUSD School Reopening Updates

Phased Reopening In-Person Instruction for Students beginning April 26, 2021

Our phased reopening plan will begin on April 26, 2021, with the reopening of specific grade levels for students whose parents have selected the hybrid instructional model in the following grade levels:


- Child Development Center (CDC)
- Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K)
- Transitional Kindergarten (TK)
- Kindergarten
- First Grade



- Second Grade
- Third grade students only enrolled in a combination class with second grade
- Students enrolled in Special Day Class (SDC) for Pre-K to Grade 2

Students in grade levels not listed above will be offered the opportunity to participate in the District's in-person Summer School/Extended School Year in mid-June.

Students in grade levels 3-12 will remain in the full-time distance learning model due to their participation in state assessments beginning on April 12, 2021.
